
FDOT Traffic Alert for Big Bend Area

Chipley – Drivers are reminded to practice caution while traveling in and around work zones in Northwest Florida.

Gadsden County:

- Construction is underway on **S.R. 8 (I-10) West of County Road (C.R.) 270A (Flat Creek Road) to West of S.R. 267 (Pat Thomas Parkway)** – Lane closures are scheduled for the evening of Sunday, April 29 through the morning of Friday, May 4. Lane closures are prohibited all day Friday, Saturday, and Sunday through Thursday night from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- **S.R. 267 (Pat Thomas Parkway) from south of I-10 to U.S. 90** – There will be intermittent lane closures northbound and southbound from Spooner Road to Joe Adams Road beginning Monday, April 30 and continuing through Friday, May 4. The closures will be in effect each day from 8:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. All travel lanes will be clearly marked. These lane closures allow the contractor to pave the widened shoulders, and pour curb and gutter.
- The speed limit on **S.R. 10 (U.S. 90) from east of North Pittman Street to west of North Graves Street** will be reduced from 45 MPH to 35 MPH starting Monday, April 30.

Jefferson County:

- **C.R. 158 Old Lloyd Creek Road** – There are no anticipated lane closures at this time.

Leon County:

- **U.S. 90 from Fernwood Road to east of the Gadsden County line** – Lane closures will be from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekly with both eastbound and westbound inside travel lanes closed due to pipework and drainage improvements in the median.
- **U.S. 90 from Gadsden County line to Fernwood Road** – Resurfacing work continues along the corridor, crews are installing sod and completing turn lane and medium work. Workers will begin paving crossovers within the next week.
- **S.R. 61 (Thomasville Road) near Glenview Drive** – Closures for the inside lane of both northbound and southbound traffic are scheduled for Tuesday, May 1 to Thursday, May 3 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- **S.R. 20 (Blountstown Highway) at S.R. 10 (Tennessee Street)** – Motorists can expect lane closures for starting Monday, April 30 through Tuesday, May 1 from 9 p.m. until 5 a.m. while workers perform soil testing near road.

All planned construction activities are weather dependent and may be delayed or rescheduled in the event of inclement weather. Motorists are reminded to pay attention to the speed limit when traveling through the construction area, to watch for construction equipment entering and leaving

the roadway, and to use caution when driving through the workzone. Speeding fines double when workers are present.
